About University College London

About the Centre for Research and Analysis of Migration

CRAM is an interdisciplinary research centre based in the Department of Economics at UCL conducting research on migration and labour economics. The main offices are situated in Drayton House, a recently refurbished building adjacent to UCL's main campus in central London. The Centre shares the building with the Department of Economics. The researcher will work in Drayton House.

The Position

The researchers will have obtained a PhD in economics and will have demonstrated an aptitude for research of the highest quality. The researchers will have interpersonal skills and intellectual breadth.
