

## **Doctoral or post-doctoral position (reference number: IAB-350/2012)**

### **IAB, Institute for Employment Research, Nuremberg (Germany)**

The Department of International Comparisons and European Integration of the IAB-Nuremberg seeks applications for a doctoral or post-doctoral position in the field of empirical methods or migration research, to be filled as soon as possible.

The Institute for Employment Research (IAB) is the research institute of the German Federal Employment agency. We are independent in our research and co-operate closely with universities (e.g the University of Nuremberg-Erlangen, the University of Bamberg and the University of Regensburg). The IAB is cross-linked in international research networks, and presents research results in scientific journals and on academic conferences. The position is a part-time position (75 per cent of the weekly working time). The tasks will comprise the establishment of a novel data set for migration research, which combines survey and administrative micro data in Germany. Specific expertise in the areas of quantitative empirical methods, survey methods and/or other methods of data collection is expected. In addition, knowledge in the field of migration research and the labour market implications of immigration is welcome.

Candidates are expected to hold a masters degree in economics or social sciences, to have profound knowledge of quantitative empirical methods, and experience in a scientific environment. The successful candidate may have started a PhD, have an active research program, the potential to publish in leading academic journals, and enjoys economic policy analysis. Ideally, she/he should have completed some studies or research abroad and has a good working knowledge of English.

Salary depends on the public sector pay scheme (TV-BA) relying on qualification and work experience. IAB offers a contract until **December 31, 2014**. Contract prolongation depends on external funding and on the evaluation of the research record after this period.
