About University College London

About the Centre for Research and Analysis of Migration

CReAM is an interdisciplinary research centre based in the Department of Economics at UCL conducting research on migration and labour economics. The main offices are situated in Drayton House, a recently refurbished building adjacent to UCL's main campus in central London. The Centre shares the building with the Department of Economics. The researchers will work in Drayton House.

The Positions

CReAM has one opening for a postdoctoral position for two years initially, starting 1st September 2010.

Salary

The starting salary for this position will be on UCL Grade 7 (28,983 - 35,646) per annum plus £2,795 London Allowance, depending upon experience.

Main Duties

The candidate will participate in projects relating to the NORFACE-funded research project: Migration: Integration, Impact and Interaction or to *CReAM*'s other research activities on labour economics.

The researcher will have obtained a PhD in economics and will have demonstrated an aptitude for research of the highest quality. The researchers will have interpersonal skills and intellectual breadth.
